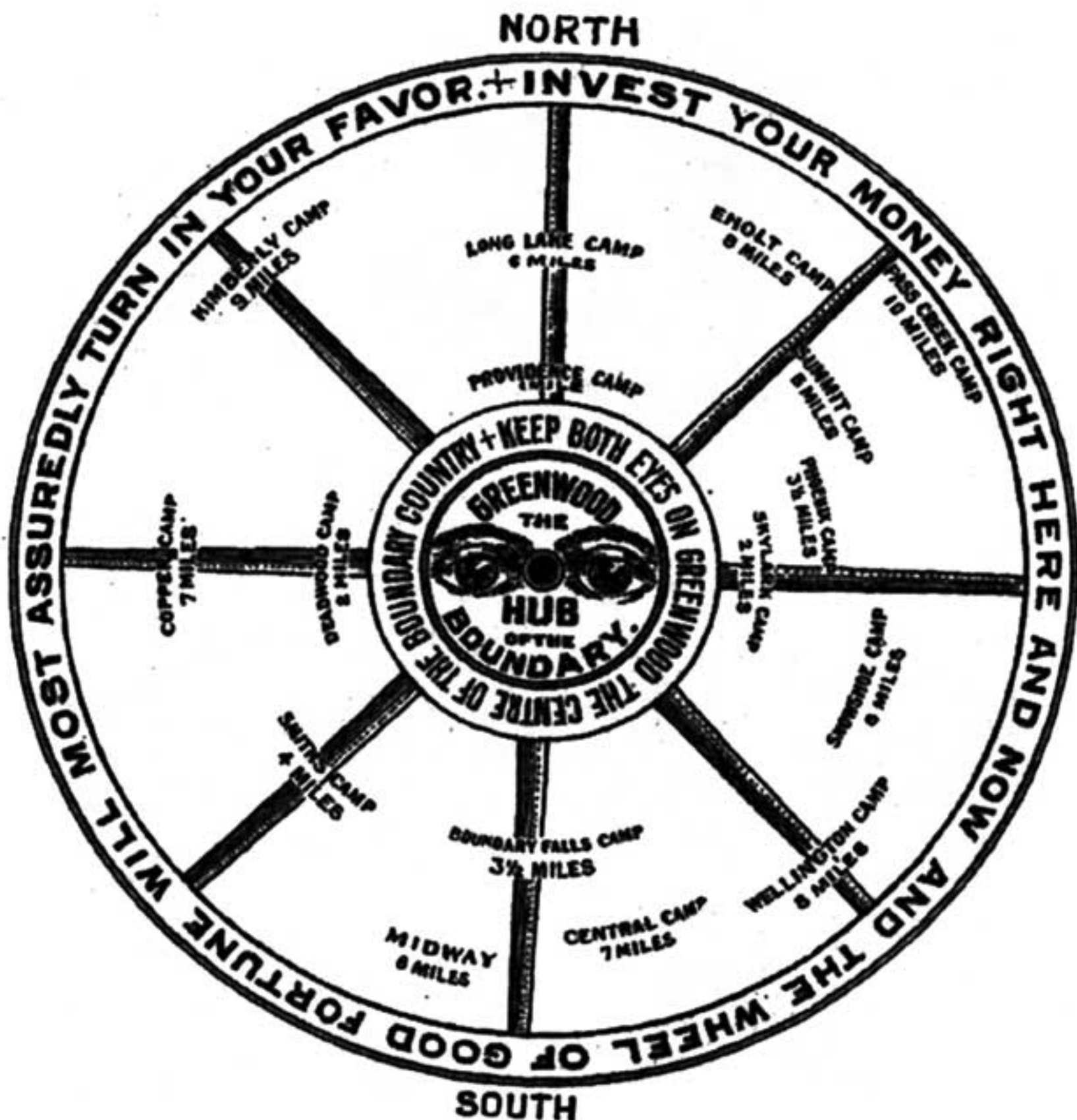
CANADA 150

In January 2017 the Province of British Columbia wanted to acknowledge this significant milestone by investing in legacy, cultural and heritage projects in communities throughout the province. This one-time grant opportunity administered through the BC Museums Association and Heritage BC would give our society the prospect of paying tribute to our mining heritage. The idea of a bronze statue depicting an early hard-rock miner was decided upon. This would create a lasting legacy to the hundreds of miners who came from distant lands to the Boundary seeking their fortune.

In April 2017 we received notification our project was approved. Renowned BC sculptor, Nathan Scott of Victoria was commissioned to bring this exciting project to fruition.

At a later date an ore car on rails, signage and lighting will be incorporated to create this wonderful lasting legacy to the mining industry of Greenwood and area.
