## **Rules and Regulations**

- Competition in the Grand Forks Fall Fair is open to everyone from near and far except where restrictions are noted in the particular division, section or class. No exhibits will be accepted by mail but must be brought in by the owner or by a representative.
- All livestock must be owned, all horticulture and field produce must be grown, all arts, crafts, cooking, baking, etc., must be done by the exhibitor.
- Exhibitors may enter as many entries as they wish in any one class except where otherwise stated.
- 4. Entry fees for exhibitors in all open classes are as shown at the start of each division (whether the exhibitor be adult or child). There is no entry for children's classes or 4-H Club classes.
- 5. Entry forms should be completed and in the hands of the Office Manager along with the entry fees not later than August 31. Early entry is wanted and encouraged to enable facilities to be provided for display and to enable the Office Manager to send out tags by mail to the exhibitor so he can attach them to his exhibit and place his exhibits at the Fair without any delay when he arrives here.
- 6. Time for entering exhibits for the Exhibition Buildings begins at 1:00 p.m., Friday, September 8th, and ends at 7:00 p.m. the same day. Time for entering livestock exhibits begins at 1:00 p.m. on Friday, September 8th and ends at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, September 9th.
- Judging in the Exhibition Building will begin at 8:00 p.m., Friday, September 8th. Judging of livestock will begin at 9:00 a.m., Saturday, September 9th.
- 8. The decision of the judges shall be final. The judges need only award such prizes as they consider the exhibit warrants. They will exercise their discretion as to whether they shall award first, second, third, or any prize, especially in classes where there are only one or two entries.
- 9. No judge shall be an exhibitor in any class which he or she shall be judging.
- The public will be barred from exhibits during judging with the exception of livestock exhibits where public attendance is encouraged.




